Appointment of Senior Governor

The University of Aberdeen is pleased to announce the appointment of Martin Gilbert as Senior Governor to lead its governing body, the University Court.

Martin is a graduate of the University of Aberdeen and has become one of the UK's most prominent business leaders. He co-founded Aberdeen Asset Management, was previously Chairman of FirstGroup and has been Deputy Chairman of Sky plc since 2011. Alongside these commercial roles, Martin has undertaken non-executive roles within government at home and abroad and has recently become a Patron of the Aberdeen Law Project.



Accepting the appointment, Martin Gilbert said, "I am honoured that the Court has appointed me to this role. I have always valued the part the University played in my education and it is wonderful to have this opportunity to help it achieve its strategy and its global ambition. The University is one of Scotland's

great institutions and I am passionate about ensuring it continues to thrive and extending its reputation as a university that is competing with the very best in the world."

The appointment is for a three year term of office with effect from 1 January 2017. Martin succeeds Sir Moir Lockhead, who retired from the role at the end of December having made a valuable contribution to the life, work and governance of the University for 14 years.

Alumni Celebration of Carols raises thousands for dementia research

The third annual Alumni Celebration of Carols on the 21st of December 2016 was a huge success, attracting over 500 attendees and raising thousands of pounds for the University's research into dementia.

Featuring readings from Sir Tony Robinson, Laura Main, Classic FM's Anne-Marie Minhall and University Principal Professor Sir Ian

Diamond and hosted by Bill Turnbull in his usual professional manner, the event featured the spectacular University of Aberdeen Chamber Choir under the expert guidance of Professor Paul Mealor. A particular highlight was a re-working of In The Bleak Midwinter, about which Sir Tony tweeted his praise shortly before the event was broadcast on Classic FM on December 23rd. The 17-year old French trumpet player Lucienne Renaudin Vary, a rising star in the trumpet world, also played a pair of extremely impressive pieces. Feedback from the audience was hugely positive, many of whom donated afterwards and helped bring the total raised for dementia research to over £11,000.

Enormous thanks are due to the vast number of people who attended the event and made it possible, especially the Reverend Canon Stephen Evans who continues to offer us the use of the fantastic St Marylebone Parish Church for the event. This year's concert is already scheduled to take place on the 21st of December 2017 so mark it in your diaries!

Aberdeen alumnus publishes proof of famous mathematical puzzle

Aberdeen mathematics graduate Christopher Garvie has recently had a paper published containing a proof of the famous Twin Prime Conjecture, a mathematical conundrum which has baffled mathematicians for decades. A twin prime is a prime number (i.e. a number divisible only by itself or by one) that is either two less or two more than another prime number, for example the twin prime pair 41 and 43. Twin primes become increasingly rare as the range of examination is increased but it is a longstanding conjecture that there are infinitely many twin primes. Many mathematicians have published papers attempting to prove the theory but until now all have turned out to be flawed or short of definitive proof.

Christopher's paper is sure to be a hot topic of debate in the world of mathematics. You can read the article in <u>Notes on Number Theory and</u>




University of Aberdeen Rowett Institute officially opens superb new facility

The University of Aberdeen Rowett Institute is arguably the UK's leading research centre for food and nutrition and currently has the greatest concentration of nutrition researchers in the UK. Throughout its long and proud history it has made a significant impact on animal health and human nutrition.

The Institute recently entered an exciting new era with the completion of a new building on the University's health campus at Foresterhill, Aberdeen; after over 100 years on its original site, this represented a major change for all concerned. Spread over six floors and with a total floor space of around 10,000 square metres, the building was one of the most complex projects ever undertaken by the University. This fantastic new building was officially opened by HRH The Duchess of Rothesay, Chancellor of the University, on Wednesday 18th January 2017. Her Royal Highness was met by The Lord Provost of Aberdeen on arrival and then enjoyed a tour of the facilities hosted by Professor Sir Ian Diamond, Principal of the University and Professor Peter Morgan, Director of the Rowett. Her Royal Highness met several research staff and heard about some of the innovative research being undertaken and was also introduced to Ian Gourlay, one of the Rowett's longest-serving volunteers, who has taken part in fifteen studies to date. Volunteers are essential to the Rowett's research and it is important to recognise their contribution.

New exhibition opens at King's Museum: Aberdonians in the Americas

A new exhibition at the University of Aberdeen's King's Museum explores the lives of five local collectors who travelled to Latin America in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. They went to seek their fortunes for different reasons — as explorers, doctors, miners, or missionaries — and met cultures and experiences strikingly different from their lives at home.

Aberdonians in the Americas draws on the University of Aberdeen's rich South American collections to explore the hidden stories behind the donations that these collectors made to the University of Aberdeen of material relating to their work and travels. It includes objects whose connections with local collectors were re-discovered during the course of the exhibition, from a stalactite from a Bolivian tin mine to a 'diabolical' mata mata turtle that was fished out of the River Amazon.

Aberdonians in the Americas: Migrants and adventurers from Mexico to Paraguay is on display at King's Museum, Old Aberdeen Town House, High Street, Aberdeen, AB24 3EN. For more information, listen to this BBC radio interview about the exhibition or see the museum website.

University Chamber Choir CD reaches #3 in UK classical chart

On 12 January the University's Chamber Choir, along with the Pro-Chancellor, Principal and other staff at the University, found itself in Ballater Church in the company of the Chancellor, the Duchess of Rothesay and Prince Charles for the launch of a special CD on the University's Vox Regis label. The concert was a huge success, with the choir performing arrangements of Burns taken from *Immortal Memory*, which was released on 20 January. The choir was joined by

traditional singer Robert Lovie and there was fiddle-playing by award-winning alumnus Raemond Jappy. Amazingly, and with not a little help from Classic FM, the CD rapidly climbed the charts, peaking at number three in the classical chart. All the University's recordings raise money for charitable causes, in this case the projects established in Ballater by HRH The Duke of Rothesay and The Dumfries House Trust following the 2016 floods.

A second CD, of Scottish contemporary bassoon music in a variety of styles played by Lesley Wilson, was released on the same day and is in aid of research into Parkinson's disease taking place here at the University of Aberdeen. Lesley was Principal Bassoon with the RSNO, and is now our bassoon tutor. The CD contains première recordings, including pieces by Aberdeen composers at the University.

The first CD in the series, *O Sacrum Convivium*, is a collection of choral works sung by the Choir of King's College, Aberdeen, interspersed with organ pieces by J.S. Bach played on the magnificent Aubertin organ in King's College Chapel; it has received glowing praise in both general and specialist media, including five stars in *Choir & Organ*. The CD includes pieces by Aberdeen staff (Phillip Cooke and Paul Mealor) and postgraduate research students (John F Hudson and Thomas LaVoy) alongside choral favourites and proceeds from the sale of the CD will support Aberdeen's research on dementia.


